Sportsman (sponsored by N F Preen Fencing) Curtis Smith - Wheelchair Basketball. A key member of the Canterbury team competing in the national competition and in Australia, Curtis has been selected for the NZ team for the Asia Oceania 2018 World Championship qualification tournament. Anton Cooper - Mountain Biking. Won his first UCI MTB race in Switzerland this year along with a string of top 20 finishes on the UCI circuit. Currently ranked 6th in the world and the youngest

rider in the world's top 20. Wyatt Crockett - Rugby. A member of Woodend Rugby Club and Super Rugby champion Crusaders, Wyatt recently became the most capped Super Rugby player of all time. Also holds the

record for most consecutive test wins (45) with the All Blacks.

Bronwyn Dibb - Trampoline. Finished 4th at the World Games against the world's top 10 Double Mini Trampoline athletes - a

feat GymSports NZ named as the trampoline "International Performance of the Year". Ella Greenslade - Rowing. Reserve Single Skull for the NZ Elite Rowing Team and a member of the NZ team competing at the U23 World Champs. 1st in U22 Pair and 2nd in Women's 8 at NZ National Championships.

Momoka Kabori - Golf. Competing in North America Momoka has achieved top 10 finishes including Canadian Jnr Girls (7th), West Coast Conference Champs (9th) and Bruin Wave Invitational (7th). World Amateur Ranking #231.

Junior Sportsman (sponsored by Rangiora New World) Fraser Sheat - Cricket. Named NZ Young Cricketer of the Year following the National Secondary Schools finals in December 2016. Played for Canterbury Country Cricket Snr team and was selected for Canterbury A matches and Sydney Tour. Kazuma Kobori - Golf. Canterbury's top-ranked U16 golfer, Kazuma has found form at a number of age-group championships including the NSW Boys Amateur (6th), South Island U17 (2nd) and NZ Age Group Champs (2nd in U15). Ben Oliver - Mountain Biking. Great results in 2017 have put Ben on the shortlist for the 2018 Commonwealth Games. With several top finishes at U23 level at races in Europe as well victory at NZ Nationals and Oceania Champs, Ben's U23 ranking is #1 in NZ and his world ranking has climbed to 10th.

Junior Sportswoman (sponsored by Rural Livestock) Jorja Jarrett - Karate. Jorja's results in 2017 include Gold, Silver & Bronze medals in the 14-17 year age group at the NZ National Karate Champs, NZ Open, National Secondary Schools Champs and Canterbury Champs.

Tegan Bishop - Surfing. Canterbury and South Island women's champion in Open, U20 and U17 grades, Tegan was selected for the Canterbury Scholastic Surf team and the NZ team to compete at the World Junior Surfing Champs in Sept 2017. Macey Fraser - Football. A key member of NZ Football's U17 team which qualified for the 2018 World Cup, Macey is also one of the youngest members of the Mainland Pride Football team which took out the National Women's League in 2016. Ella Hansen - BMX. Ella achieved first place finishes in her age group at the Oceania BMX Champs, NZ Nationals, South Island Champs and the Wellington Champs. She is a member of the NZ Senior Development Squad and was the North Canterbury BMX Club's "Most Outstanding Senior Rider."
